Please join us at our May Manzanita meeting to welcome a representative from Councilwoman Williams' office to discuss the **lighting and safety of our alleys** as well as the **possible moving of solid waste services (trash collection) from the alleys to curbside**. We also will be enjoying a discussion with our Manzanita Phoenix Police Community Action Officer (CAO) Garrick Henry regarding **police reporting protocols and vacation safety** for our homes.

Manzanita Block Watch's **May general meeting** will be on the **4<sup>th</sup> Thursday evening of May, May 26, 2016**, starting at 6:30 PM and ending by 8:00 PM in the Manzanita Elementary School cafeteria (Butler & 39<sup>th</sup> Avenues). As always the meeting will **start with free pizza and cold drinks** so you won't have to deal with an empty stomach if you're coming straight from a day at work. The evening's business **agenda will start by about 6:45 PM**.

We really hope you will join us in continuing the discussions with the Councilwoman's office to make our alleys safer and with CAO Henry regarding Phoenix Police protection and service to Manzanita. Please think about these topics ahead of time and come ready with your comments and questions. **This is OUR Community**—join us for the meeting and help us work toward improving it.

**Note:** In an effort to keep discussion more on track with the topic being covered at any point during our meeting we will be trying a new procedure for attendees to make comments or ask questions. If you want to make comments or have questions on the alley discussion, the trash collection discussion, or the police reporting protocols and home safety we ask that you do so using a coordinating 3x5 index card which will be available for these purposes. Just complete the related card with your comments or questions and turn it in at the beginning of the meeting. If more points come up as the presenters speak just jot down more comments or questions on another card. There will be time for your questions and comments after each speaker. Using the cards your name will be called for you to make your comments or ask your questions.

## Homes of the Month

A special "thank you" to the growing number of Manzanita residents who have been working to improve the appearance of their properties! We all appreciate your effort, and it helps improve all of our property values as well.

This issue we recognize the following for the special pride they are showing by maintaining their houses and yards in great condition:

**Grid 1: 8252 N. 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue** — this stucco and stone house obviously has been updated quite a bit but its attractive curb appeal also is due to a small but great looking front yard which has a wonderfully maintained grassy area, 2 very tall beautiful palms, and a neat stone border area around the grass which has its own series of trimmed bushes.

**Grid 2: 8648 N. 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue** — a neat and weed free gravel and stone yard both in front and along the house sides with many smaller cacti highlighting the maintained house exterior, clean car port and nice block fence.

**Grid 3: 8601 N. 41<sup>st</sup> Drive** — a proudly flown US flag may first catch your eye when passing this neat and well maintained house with its pleasing, weed free yard which has both rock along the sides and grass directly in front as well as several pleasant plantings closer in.

**Grid 4: 4107 W. Harmont Drive** — a clean, weed free rock front yard accented by blooming flowers by the mail box and neatly trimmed bushes and a tree along the front of the house which itself is well maintained with a clean carport and driveway.

## Be the Light in a Dark Situation

A few weeks ago when I got home from work, I noticed some strange behavior at my neighbor's house. Trying to be inconspicuous myself, I carefully watched as a young man that I'd never seen before was dragging the free-standing range out the sliding glass door in the backyard and into the alley! I called 911 and within minutes the police were on the scene, chasing the young man down the street and apprehending him. After some phone calls and investigating, the man was released, but not before learning that he couldn't perform illegal acts in this neighborhood!

It was scary. I was apprehensive about calling the authorities when I really didn't know what was going on. He could have had permission to remove the stove. He could have been asked to do it by the owners. I didn't know. But I had a feeling, and I went with it. And it turned out to be right!

How many times have you walked away from a situation and wondered what the outcome was? How many times have you seen someone riding their bike slowly down the street, and you know you've never seen them before? How many times have you witnessed strange things happen on your street and been too afraid to get involved? How many times did you know something bad was happening, but you "didn't have the time" to take action?

It's natural to not want to be a part of something bad — but being the light in a dark situation is not being part of something bad, it's being part of something GOOD!

And after I thought about it like that, and realized why I'm involved in my neighborhood and why I'm part of the Manzanita Block Watch, it wasn't hard at all to get involved and turn a bad situation into something good. My neighbor's house was locked up by the police. They made the man return the stove to the house. They instructed him to stay far away or he wouldn't be so lucky to walk away next time. And they thanked me for making everyone a little safer.

Because when criminals are apprehended, they learn that they can't take advantage of people in that area. If we all fulfill our obligation to take action in situations like this, it makes Manzanita safer for everyone. It's our duty as neighbors.

## Local Food Pantry Available

Hope's Cupboard is a ministry of nearby Trinity United Methodist Church, 3104 W. Glendale Ave, Phoenix. It is a food pantry stocked by church members and friends. One Manzanita resident is quite active in this church and wants to be sure any Manzanita residents needing a bit of help are aware of it.

The pantry is open on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month from 10:30 AM – Noon. In May and June these Sundays are May 15 and June 19. Every person/family receives a prepacked bag of food. Each bag contains 1 box of cereal, 2 cans of fruit, 2 cans of vegetables, 1 package of pasta, 1 jar/can of pasta sauce, 2 cans of soup, 1 can of meat, 1 jar of peanut butter, 1 box of macaroni and cheese, 1 sleeve of saltine crackers, 3 cups of rice and 3 cups of beans.
